A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to prohibit the Secretary of Defense from requiring that members of the Armed Forces receive a COVID-19 vaccine, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Respecting Our Ser-
- 5 vicemembers Act".

- 1 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON COVID-19 VACCINATION REQUIRE-
- 2 MENTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED
- 3 FORCES.
- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 55 of title 10, United
- 5 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 1110b
- 6 the following new section:
- 7 "§ 1110c. Prohibition on COVID-19 vaccination re-
- 8 quirement
- 9 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense may
- 10 not require any member of an Armed Force to receive a
- 11 vaccine with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019
- 12 (COVID-19).
- 13 "(b) Member of an Armed Force Defined.—In
- 14 this section the term 'member of an Armed Force' means
- 15 a member of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps,
- 16 Coast Guard, or Space Force, including any member of
- 17 a reserve component thereof on active service or active sta-
- 18 tus.".
- 19 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
- 20 at the beginning of chapter 55 of such title is amended
- 21 by inserting after the item relating to section 1110b the
- 22 following new item:

"1110c. Prohibition on COVID-19 vaccination requirement.".
