## A BILL

To protect the right of law-abiding citizens to transport knives interstate, notwithstanding a patchwork of State and local prohibitions that burden citizens.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Knife Owners' Protec-
- 5 tion Act of 2025".
- 6 SEC. 2. INTERSTATE TRANSPORTATION OF KNIVES.
- 7 (a) Definitions.—As used in this section—
- 8 (1) the term "State" means any of the 50
- 9 States, the District of Columbia, American Samoa,

1 Guam, Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, 2 the Virgin Islands of the United States, and any 3 other territory of the United States; and 4 (2) the term "transport"— 5 (A) includes staying in temporary lodging 6 overnight, common carrier misrouting or delays, 7 stops for food, fuel, vehicle maintenance, emer-8 gencies, medical treatment, and all other activ-9 ity related to the overall journey of the indi-10 vidual; and 11 (B) does not include any transportation of 12 1 or more knives with the intent to commit any 13 offense punishable by imprisonment for a term 14 exceeding 1 year involving the use or threatened 15 use of force against another, or with knowledge, 16 or reasonable cause to believe, that such an of-17 fense is to be committed in the course of, or 18 arising from, such journey. 19 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—Notwithstanding any provision 20 of any law or any rule or regulation of the United States, 21 or of a State or any political subdivision of a State, any individual who is not otherwise prohibited by Federal law 23 from possessing, transporting, shipping, or receiving a knife or knives shall be entitled to transport a knife or knives from any place where the individual may lawfully

possess, carry, or transport such a knife or knives to any 2 other place where the individual may lawfully possess, 3 carry, or transport such a knife or knives if— 4 (1) in the case of transportation by motor vehi-5 cle, the knife is, or the knives are, not directly acces-6 sible from the passenger compartment of the trans-7 porting motor vehicle, or, in the case of a motor ve-8 hicle without a compartment separate from the pas-9 senger compartment, the knife is, or the knives are, 10 contained in a locked container, locked glove com-11 partment, or locked console; 12 (2) in the case of transportation by air, the 13 knife is, or the knives are, contained in a locked con-14 tainer and are not in the passenger cabin of the air-15 craft; or 16 (3) in the case of transportation by other 17 means (including any conveyance over land, or on or 18 through water), the knife is, or the knives are, con-19 tained in a locked container. 20 (c) Emergency Knives.— 21 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2), 22 any knife or tool designed for enabling escape in an 23 emergency incorporating a blunt tipped safety blade,

a guarded blade, or both, for cutting safety belts—

1	(A) may be carried in the passenger com-
2	partment of a transporting motor vehicle; and
3	(B) shall not be required to be secured in
4	a locked container, locked glove compartment
5	or locked console.
6	(2) Exception.—This subsection shall not
7	apply to the transport of any knife or tool described
8	in paragraph (1) in the passenger cabin of an air-
9	craft the passengers of which are subject to airport
10	screening procedures of the Transportation Security
11	Administration.
12	(d) Temporary Lodging.—Subject to the require-
13	ments under subsection (b), a knife or knives may be kept
14	accessible in any form of temporary lodging overnight, as
15	described in subsection $(a)(2)(A)$ .
16	(e) No Arrest or Detention.—An individual who
17	is transporting a knife or knives in compliance with this
18	section may not be arrested or otherwise detained for vio-
19	lation of any law or any rule or regulation of a State or
20	any political subdivision of a State related to the posses-
21	sion, transportation, or carrying of knives, unless there is
22	probable cause to believe that the individual is in violation
23	of 1 or more of the requirements under subsection (b)
24	(f) CLAIM OR DEFENSE.—

(1) In General.—An individual may assert this section as a claim or defense in any civil or criminal action or proceeding.

(2) BURDEN OF PROOF.—If an individual asserts this section as a claim or defense in a criminal proceeding, the relevant State or political subdivision shall bear the burden of proving, beyond a reasonable doubt, that the individual was not in compliance with the requirements under subsection (b).

## (g) Right of Action.—

- (1) IN GENERAL.—Any individual who, under color of any statute, ordinance, regulation, custom, or usage, of any State or political subdivision of a State, subjects, or causes to be subjected, any individual to the deprivation of the rights, privileges, or immunities set forth in this section, shall be liable to the individual so deprived in an action at law, suit in equity, or other proper proceeding for redress.
- (2) Attorney's fees.—When an individual asserts this section as a claim or defense, the court shall award the prevailing party (including any party who receives a favorable resolution through a decision by a court, settlement of a claim, withdrawal of criminal charges, or change of a statute or regulation), other than a State or any political subdivision

1	of a State or its employees or representatives, a rea-
2	sonable attorney's fee.
3	(h) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this sec-
4	tion shall be construed in any way—
5	(1) to limit any right to possess, carry, or
6	transport a knife or knives under applicable State
7	law; or
8	(2) to impose additional restrictions or require-
9	ments on interstate travel by air with a knife or
10	knives.
